Physical geography	Natural features of a place. E.g hill, sea, beach
Human geography	A feature of a place which is made by humans- e.g road, shop, school
key	An inset on a map that explains the symbols, provides a scale.
map	A drawing of part of the earth's surface.
symbol	A picture on a map that represents a feature of the place.
town	A town is a larger settlement than a village. There are usually a few thousand people living in a town. Towns often have places of worship, schools and pubs.
aerial Photo	A photo taken from the air

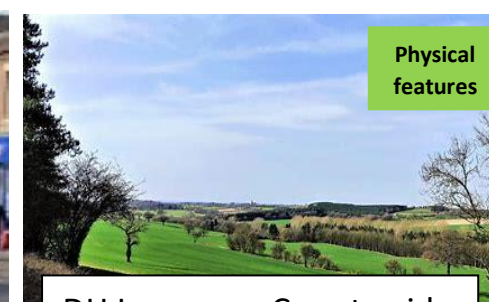

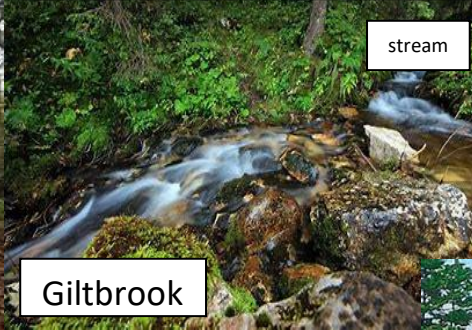
DH Lawrence Countryside
