<p>Most children when interviewed felt teaching staff dealt appropriately and promptly with any issues that were brought to their attention. However some children felt that issues regarding 'bullying' were not always dealt with efficiently during lunchtimes.</p> <p><b>Action:</b> Training for mid-day staff around identifying and addressing children's concerns</p>	<p>The children felt bullying wasn't an issue in school, they expressed that any issues if arisen were dealt with immediately. They expressed how kind the children were to each other across the year groups. They said they hadn't had any personal experience of anyone being bullied, they felt most of the children at Lynncroft were always happy when in school.</p>	<p>All of the children knew that they should tell a member of staff or a responsible adult if they were being bullied in any way. They knew what the definition of bullying was and were able to quote 'STOP'. However a couple of children said they would rather put their concern into a worry box rather than tell an adult.</p> <p><b>Action:</b> Create central area for worry boxes</p>	<p>All the children said they hadn't experienced being bullied and that any if any incidents do happen they are dealt with quickly.</p>	<p>During the interview the y6 pupils felt that there had been a big improvement with any bullying issues during their time at Lynncroft. They felt they were listened to more now and that any inappropriate behaviour was dealt with swiftly. They commented that most people were friends with each other and all the year groups helped and supported their peers.</p>
