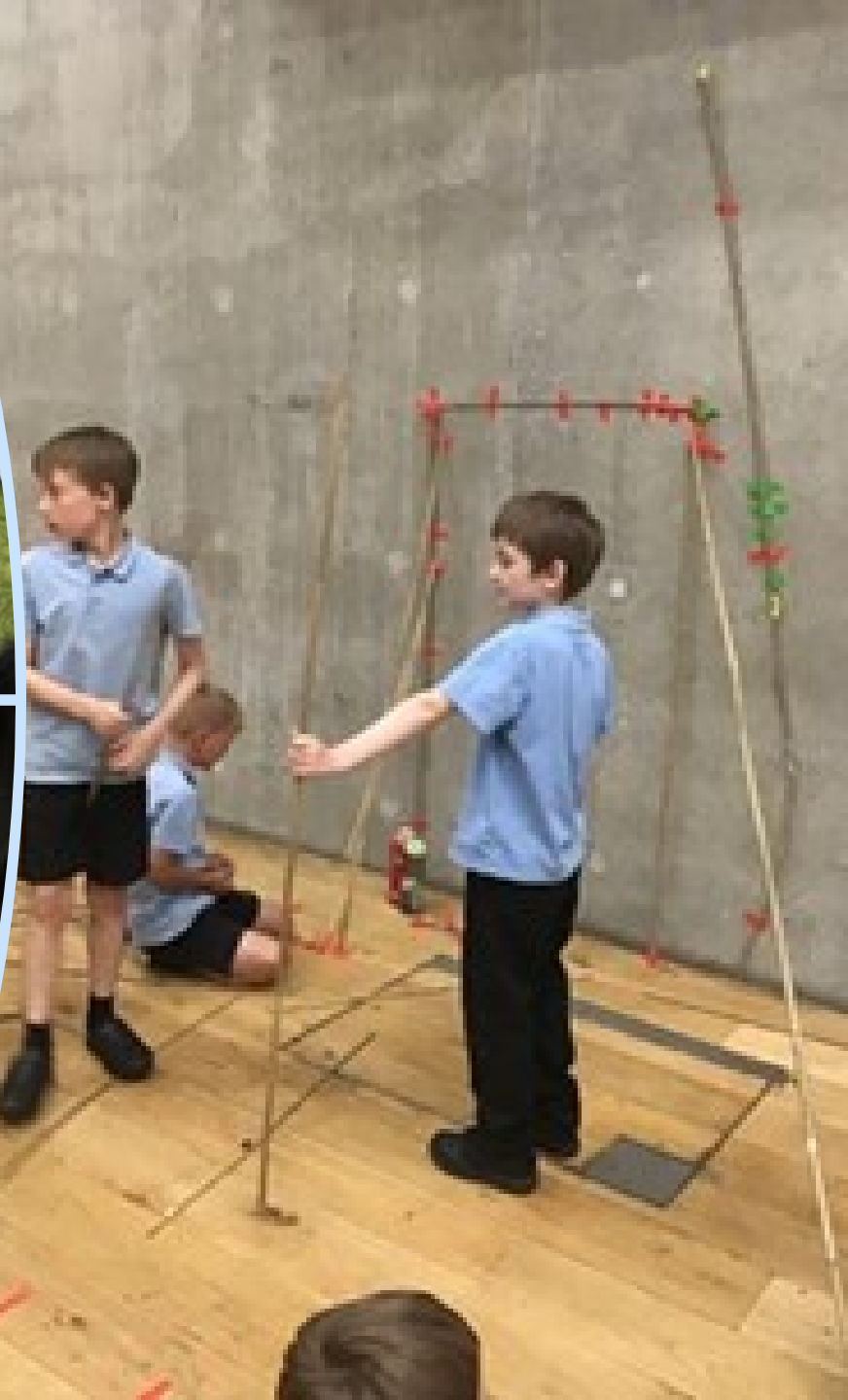
Curriculum and Enrichment

We value outdoor learning and have outdoor classrooms, growing areas, an outdoor gym and play equipment and our own wildlife area with a wood, pond, and sensory area.

During their time at school children will be taught by music teachers to play at least two musical instruments and will also have opportunities to perform in music concerts and school plays.

Our sports coaches support the development of PE and Games, and children access swimming lessons at school in the summer term onsite. Children can participate in at least one sporting competition with other local schools if they wish to.

Mental Health and Wellbeing.

We are committed to supporting the Wellbeing, positive mental and physical health of our whole school community. This is embedded in every aspect of our school life. Mrs. Gascoigne, who is an accredited mental health first aider, is our pastoral lead who is responsible for organising wellbeing support.

We are a Trauma informed school. We deliver a range of support systems in school, including Nurture, Forest schools, ELSA and Drawing and talking, as well as working closely with outside agencies.

Safeguarding and child protection is a priority. When there are concerns, we work with other agencies in partnership.



Nursery

We have our own Nursery school which is run by qualified and experienced teaching staff.

Our Nursery Teacher plans a rich curriculum that supports the early development of our youngest children, in an exciting well resourced indoor and outdoor area.

A typical session in Nursery would involve some speaking and listening time, stories and songs, opportunities to play with a range of equipment inside and outside to support children's physical, emotional and mental development.

Activities include sand and water play, fine motor skills activities, drawing and painting, small world imaginary play, construction, and out- door activities such as the mud kitchen, trikes and climbing.

Our Nursery children also access Forest School in our woodland, musical theatre lessons with 'Attic' and Karate Lessons on a weekly basis.



Nursery

We work very closely with our foundation 2 team to ensure a smooth transition for our children into school.

Children can start in our nursery the school term after their third birthday for 15 hours a week over 5 days. A morning or afternoon session.

Children whose parents have a 30-hour nursery code, can attend all day during school hours.

Inclusion and SEND Provision

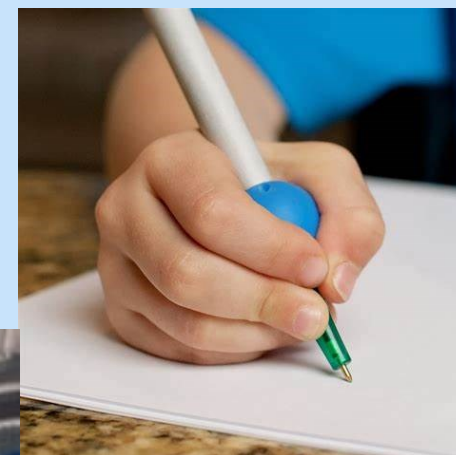
Every child in our school matters and we strive to provide all children a broad and balanced curriculum. We monitor the progress of all our children and aim to identify any needs as early as possible.

There are times when some children require additional or different provision to support their learning.

We work with families and outside agencies to identify the needs of all our children and focus on inclusive practices to support and remove any barriers.

Extra -Curricular Activities and Wrap around Childcare.

We offer a range of free school clubs and activities as an extension to the curriculum throughout the school year. Examples are cookery, choir, art, a range of sports including dance.

We are proud to be an OPAL school and strongly believe in the value of purposeful play.

Children are encouraged to have an understanding of the world they live in. We find out about local charities and industries and will fund raise and support where they can.

For example: litter picking, collecting warm clothes and food for those in need.

Our Breakfast club and After school clubs on the school site provide the wrap around child-care at a small cost. Both are run by staff members and offer supervised play activities with snacks.

Breakfast club runs from 7.30 am at £3.50 a day and After school club until 5.15pm at £4 for each hour a day. These are all pre-bookable via the school office and our online payment system SQUID.



Governors

Our active Governing body support the overall vision and direction of the school's work. We are driven to ensure we promote the life chances of all pupils in school and are dedicated to supporting the extended curriculum in school.

This includes our annual trip to Chatsworth House for some of our children. Our chair of Governors is Mr. Hill who has been a governor in Eastwood for over 50 years.
