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Lawrence View Primary and Nursery School Curriculum Offer

Intent:

It is our intention that our Art curriculum is driven through our curriculum aims and school vision which is, 'To create a school environment where children learn and grow together to reach their full potential'; through the school leaf vales of kindness, curiosity, respect, aspiration and resilience; and the National Curriculum for Art.

At Lawrence View Primary School, we are committed to providing fun, engrossing learning opportunities to engage all children in Art to ensure skill knowledge and progression.

The Art curriculum is driven by opportunities within which children recognise how Art has shaped society, history and culture. Children understand and appreciate diversity across artwork and respectfully evaluate their own work and the work of others. During our topic-based Art lessons and 'Art Weeks' we aim to develop a love of creativity and welcome opportunities for children to discover the breadth of art.

It is our intention that children become equipped with skills, knowledge and resilience and develop aspirations to be able to fulfil their full potential.

Implement:

At Lawrence View Art is implemented through planning for topic-based art lessons, art weeks and external providers which develop a progression of skills throughout the year groups. This progression will be seen in each child's sketch book from year 1 to year 6.

Through the teaching of Art, we aim to help pupils:

- •Stimulate creativity and curiosity, exploring and experiencing different techniques, materials, processes and textures.
- Experience a broad and balanced range of art activities and show progression within these experiences.
- Deliver a tactile and sensory experience with practical learning experiences.
- •To learn about the place and role of art in life today as well as in different times and cultures.
- Develop children's ability to observe, investigate, evaluate and record the world around them through a growing variety of forms and media.
- •Through art extend and enrich other curriculum areas to widen understanding and knowledge.
- Developing respect, resilience and confidence to form opinions using a rich 'art' vocabulary through questioning.

Impact

The impact of our Art offer is to develop skills and understanding that can be transferred not only through each year group but into all aspects of life.

- Pupils will be taught how to use a range of materials creatively to designed and make products.
- •To use drawing painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experience and imagination.

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- •To develop a wide range of Art techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.
- •Understand a range of artists, craft makers and designers. Describing the difference and similarities between different practices and disciplines and making link to their own work.
- •In KS2 the skills learnt will be applied and improved by continuing to use a range of techniques including, drawing painting and sculpture with a range of materials and great artists, architects and designers in history.

EYFS -

Children in Foundation 1 and Foundation 2 develop the skills to learn different techniques through fine and gross motor skill activities. Through continuous provision they begin to develop basic skills such as painting, drawing, junk modelling and modifying clay/playdough into different shapes. This then gets them ready to develop and practise new skills in KS1.
